**Entries close FRIDAY, MAY 26, 2017!** Class entry fee is \$15.00, CLINIC is \$30.00, Junior classes - \$7.00. Late and post entries will be accepted @ \$18.00 per class. Full refund with a Vet or Doctor certificate before closing date.

No refunds after closing. Copy of current Coggins must be included with entry. **NEW! We now accept PAYPAL!!!**

**STABLING** Stalls are \$60.00 for the weekend, Friday, June 3 after 5:00 pm through Sunday. A separate \$25.00 deposit check is also required, to be returned when stall is stripped. No hay or bedding provided. Showing from a trailer - \$15.00 per day, no horse camping at trailers; overnight horses must be stabled.

**CAMPING** \$25.00 per night, no electric available. Porta-Potti near stabling and arena. Solar shower available.

**RULES** The Blue Ribbon Horse Show is not ADS approved, but ADS rules will be followed, with the exception of club rules as noted throughout prize list. Show Management reserves the right to combine or cancel classes as entries warrant. Juniors must wear ATSM/SEI approved helmets, and body protectors in Obstacle classes. All dogs must be leashed and under control while on show grounds and kept out of the way of horses and vehicles.

***Removal of bridle while equine is between the shafts means instant elimination of the animal and driver from all further classes. No hitched animals may be left unattended.***

**CLASS SCHEDULE**

***Friday, June 2 beginning at 6:00pm Show Grounds open to arrival after 3:00 pm Friday.***

Driving Derby Open to all. Navigators 14 years or older required on 4-wheeled vehicles.

A Driving Derby competition consists of one or more rounds over a course consisting of pairs of cones and marathon-type obstacles as described below. 2.1 A round is run as a timed competition with penalties converted to seconds. Total time determines placings and the lowest time wins.

2.2 The times plus penalty scores for multiple rounds are added to produce final scores and placings. 6.1 Carriage: Marathon-type carriage with iron or solid-rubber tires is encouraged. There are no required weights or track widths. 6.2 Harness: Bridle must have noseband. No type of check or auxiliary reins is allowed. Breeching is required for all single turnouts and for any vehicle without brakes. All Athletes and groom(s) must wear securely fastened protective headgear which meets ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use. Safety (Protective) vests are strongly recommended.

- 29) Single Novice Working *10% on neatness of attire.)*
